Audience Methodology



Traditional Media Rural Outlet Criteria

Outlet is located within a county that meets the below criteria:

- Population is less than 200,000 residents
- Won by President Trump in 2020 election
- Coverage was analyzed from more than 200 newspaper outlets located in key rural counties

Social Media Rural Audience Criteria

Twitter users that meet the below criteria:

- Geo-tagged in Arizona, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, or Wisconsin
- Unverified
- Do not self describe as members of the media
- Are not Geo-tagged in major metro areas connected to top 200 U.S. cities





Rural vs. National

Traditional Media Coverage Analysis



Media Coverage Key Findings

Crime is at the center of coverage among rural news outlets.

Reports of local crimes and sentencing along with news around police shootings and ongoing law enforcement scrutiny draw attention to this issue.

News around Russia was a top issue in both rural and top national news coverage.

Focus on international affairs made up a hefty 29% of coverage in top national outlets this quarter and a significant 11% of coverage in rural outlets. Notably this issue was only loosely connected to other issues covered. Rural outlets are focused on news involving Russia while national publications take a broader focus on other international issues and further implications.

Inflation was central to both rural and national coverage.

News of inflation in rural outlets was primarily centered around gas prices as outlets followed the rising prices and reported updates. The issue was often tied to ongoing Russian conflict and updates from President Biden in national coverage. While this was a central topic to overall coverage, volume was relatively low.

Energy and climate coverage was one of the most consistent issues across audiences.


Aside from rising prices and ties to Russia, coverage focused on steps toward a clean energy future and ongoing initiatives. A key difference here was a focus on electric vehicle technology in national coverage and a focus on wildlife in rural coverage.

Leading areas of coverage are aligned to Republican messaging guidance.

Narratives on inflation, schools, and COVID-19 leading both national and rural media coverage can be tied closely to guidance from national Republican initiatives.


Rural vs. Top National Coverage Topics

Media Coverage Key Findings BYSTATE



Coverage across states was fairly consistent in topic of focus and volume of coverage.

Arizona

- Has the highest proportion of news focused on crime
- Increased focused on environmental and climate protection
- News about indigenous people and school boards were central to coverage

Pennsylvania

- Coverage on COVID-19 and international affairs takes up a larger space than other states
- School-based politics is disproportionately large in PA
- Inflation is the center of conversation in PA

North Carolina



- Inflation is central to coverage
- Concerns about the economy are present throughout the network
- Focus on upcoming elections is disproportionately part of the media conversation in NC

Wisconsin



- Coverage on COVID-19 and restrictions take up a larger space than the other states, and is highly connected to other topics of coverage
- Election integrity is disproportionately represented in WI following ongoing investigations



Focus on Crime & Law Enforcement, Inflation, and Energy & Climate





Social Media Topic Analysis Key Findings



Rural social media conversations are focused on finger pointing and assigning blame for issues affecting the lives of Americans. President Biden has emerged as a consistent target of blame.

Crime & Law Enforcement

- Social conversations are politically charged focusing on crimes and sentencing around war crimes for Putin, financial and election crimes for Trump, and Biden family implications.
- Discussion of police funding is heavily scrutinized and focused on Democratic platforms.
- There is an appetite for more accountability within the justice system and broader government from police, politicians, and judges.

Inflation

- Biden is the central focus of this conversation as rural Americans are quick to attribute rising prices to his leadership.
- Gas is the commodity most in focus during discussions of inflation, with ties to Russia as well as users engaging with one another and questioning the source of the increase.
- Ties to employment and the labor market are relatively weak within the conversation, and led by discussion supporting an increase in the minimum wage when mentioned.

Energy & Climate


- Climate activists lead the conversation, urging immediacy of steps to combat climate change.
- Ties of the oil and gas industry to politics including lobbying power, pressure to produce, and pressure to keep profits at bay lead some of the most engaging discussions on the topic.
- Discussion of specific renewable energy sources is met with skepticism as users look for evidence of an efficient alternative.





Rural Social Media vs. Rural Traditional Media


Focus on international affairs, COVID-19, and inflation increases while focus on crime decreases as rural Americans move from receiving news to discussing content on social media.






Crime & Law Enforcement Highlights




Accountability and politics drive conversations on social media.



- Accountability within the justice system resonates in all areas of the conversation.
- Most talk of crimes is incredibly politically charged, and often at the national level.
- Democratic messaging has an outsized voice, with heavy risk in conversation around police funding. Rural Americans are not receptive to funding cuts and paint a picture of privilege around those calling for them.
- Mentions of Biden, Trump, Putin within this topic are direct criticisms of the politicians.
- Recent studies on crime rates are largely going unnoticed among rural audiences.
- Poverty and re-entry into workforce are gaining engagement but not yet top themes. While these discussions begin to emerge, there is an opportunity to jump into these conversations and lead.





Inflation Highlights

Perceived shortcomings of President Biden lead conversation of and debate around inflation.




- President Biden is the focus of conversation around inflation. Direct mentions of his name as well as emerging terms such as #bidenflation account for nearly 1/3 of all rural conversation on inflation.
- Social conversation among rural Americans revolves around gas prices, what they are currently, and who's to blame for their rise.
- There is no direct defense or positive conversation around President Biden in the conversation. Rural Americans will change the conversation from blame to explaining the inner workings of industry and economics but will not defend Biden directly.
- Similar to media coverage, there is very little focus on employment and labor issues tied to inflation. The most resonant subtopic was support of an increase to the minimum wage.
- Rural audiences are unforgiving to corporations who increase prices and quick to characterize their greed.










Energy & Climate Highlights



While activists lead conversation to combat climate change, rural audiences are critical of efficiency, costs, and elitism associated with renewable energy.




- Cost, rather than sustainability and combatting climate change, is the main motivator of those discussing transition to clean energy in everyday life. Value is perceived as higher when costs are coming down.
- This issue has close ties to Democratic politics, presenting both opportunity to engage and risk.
 Audiences are quick to tie clean energy solutions such as electric vehicles to privilege and wealth.
- Specific projects and policy solutions are lost in social conversation, often gaining attention only from activist organizations and politicians.
- Rural audiences are highly skeptical of real value in renewable energy and efficiency of different solutions such as solar. Concerns and questions focus on impact to their daily lives and how they will benefit personally.
- Reliance on foreign energy sources has become a key focus in light of ongoing conflict in Russia.





Network Analysis Methodology

Analysis Process



A detailed Boolean search is constructed by an analyst to identify content for analysis



The algorithm reads the content, paragraph by paragraph, to identify keywords, phrases, and entities



The algorithm draws links between content based on similar language




The algorithm then groups articles by theme and arranges clusters based on their interconnectivity, producing a topical map of conversations



Once a network is generated, it is reviewed by an analyst who interprets and names each cluster based on the content within it

Interpreting a Network


Each node represents a news story, each connection represents similar language





Rural Outlet Coverage Map








Rural Outlet Coverage by Topic










Arizona Rural Media Coverage by Topic












North Carolina Rural Media Coverage by Topic







Pennsylvania Rural Media Coverage by Topic




